A LOVE AFFAIR

Jaxnme delivers and interest grows

TRY, TRY AGAIN.

Graeme Love has lived by these words as a breeder.

And right now his persistence has him living the dream with trotting filly Jaxnme.

The daughter of Andover Hall has given Kyneton-based Love the thrills of a lifetime in an outstanding two-year-old campaign.

Love, who races the first foal out of Muscle Hill mare I Am Who I Am in partnership with Brocq Robertson and Deborah Jack (wife of the filly's trainer Russell Jack), has watched Jaxnme land two group 1 classics – the \$50,000 Aldebaran Park Vicbred Platinum Homegrown Classic and the \$100,000 Vicbred Super Series – each at Melton.

It is almost beyond belief for Love that after more than two decades as a breeder and owner he is for the first time experiencing what it is like to have a group 1 winner.

"I'm having a ball," he said.

"It's a fragile game, but the enjoyment it can provide, well that's something special." It is that fragility that led I Am Who I Am to the breeding barn much earlier than planned and consequently the arrival of Jaxnme.

Love first became involved in harness racing in 1994, with Gee Tee Falcon (a Smooth Falcon-Rowan Wood 1991 colt) and Dallas Sally (an Armbro Aussie-Dallas Linda 1992 filly) among his early interests.

Love said Gee Tee Falcon won one race, but it was Dallas Sally which really locked him in.

After winning nine times in Victoria, Dallas Sally went to Sydney, where she won four races in a row at Harold Park in September and October of 1999.

She had her last start in the Ladyship Mile, finishing down the track behind Tailamade Lombo.

Love said Dallas Sally was then put in foal, but sadly died before giving birth.

Love continued to dabble in breeding, but by his own admission without a great deal of success.

"From perhaps 20 foals, 16 were no good."

Gee Cam NZ (Cameleon US-Natty Gee NZ) was one mare made which left winners for him in partnership with the Feiss family, producing Victoria Bound NZ (by Christian Cullen) for seven wins and Last Issue NZ (Lis Mara US) eight wins. Victoria Bound also left one winner for Love.

Love said as time went on he began to take a real liking for the trotting gait.

One thing led another and he purchased a share in the Yabby Dam Racing-bred Angus Hall gelding Share Interest, racing him partnership with Brocq Robertson and Deborah Jack out of the Russell Jack stable.

That venture could not have got away to a better start, with Shared Interest winning a Breeders Crown 2yo trotting colts and geldings' heat on debut at Maryborough on August 4, 2014.

Shared Interest went on to run second to the son of Sundon Eljaykay Phoenix in the group 1 final.

If he was not already, Love was hooked on squaregaiters.

So much so he tried to purchase

another of the progeny of Shared Interest's dam Heaven Above, but without luck.

This ultimately led him to Glenferrie Farms in southern New South Wales.

Love said on arriving at the nursery, he and Russell Jack ventured to a paddock with six horses.

They had a filly in mind and as fate would have it, it was to be that Muscle Hill-Shezoneoftheboyz filly which walked straight up to Love.

"She came up to me, so I thought you're it."

She had already been named Glenferrie Crosby.

"I didn't like Crosby as a name for a filly so I changed it (to I Am Who I Am)."

Disappointingly she was never to race.

Love said she was about one month away from racing when she unfortunately broke down.

Little did Love and his fellow connections know at the time though that this misfortune would lead to the arrival of Jaxnme.

Love said Russell Jack had chosen Andover Hall as the sire for I Am Who I Am's first visit to stud.

"He knows a lot more than me and said he was a stand out, so Andover Hall it was."

The next two I Am I Who I Am offspring are both by French-bred stallion Love You - 2017 colt and 2018 filly.

Love said they had gone to Love You to introduce a different bloodline.

Love has just five horses at the moment – Jaxnme, I Am Who I Am and her two Love You foals, as well as squaregaiter Gunning (by Majestic Son), which is a half brother to I Am Who I Am and still racing.


With Jaxnme heading up the team, Love does not look like racing anything other than trotters down the track.

"I just love them," a statement testified to by a framed picture of Jaxnme that Love has on his desk.

LIVING THE DREAM

US-bred mare leaves legacy



WHEN BALLARAT FRIENDS

Michael Fryar and Dennis Foley decided to delve into the world of breeding trotters the first assignment was finding a suitable broodmare.

The research into bloodlines began.

They had bred pacing stock, but moving into squaregaiters was a whole new field.

Nine years down the track and what eventuated from that moment has realised what was then nothing more than a pipedream.

Fryar's wife Colleen is now the proud owner of a group 1 winner – Moonlight Dream, which scored in the \$100,000 Aldebaran Park Vicbred Super Series final for 4yo trotting mares at Melton.

It all goes back to that research, which led to the purchase of proven US-bred Pine Chip US broodmare Dreamlands Nancy from New Zealand.

Colleen Fryar said the acquisition stemmed back to husband Michael's interest in US hall of fame member Hickory Pride – a 1956 son of Star's Pride and Misty Hanover (by Dean Hanover) – and his half brother Hickory Smoke, a 1954 son of Titan Hanover.

Hickory Pride was a stakes winner as a two and three-year-old, and went on to a highly acclaimed stud career, with his progeny including million dollar earners Fresh Yankee and Keystone Pioneer.

She said with this interest, once
Dreamlands Nancy was sourced it
was clear she was the perfect fit with
Hickory Smoke being the sire of her
maternal great granddam Petite Yankee
US, and her maternal granddam Yankee
Spitfire being the offspring of Hickory
Pride and Petiite Yankee.

Dreamlands Nancy was purchased in foal to Monarchy US and the resulting 2010 filly Royal Dream went on to win seven times.

Moonlight Dream is the fourth foal of the mare raced by the Fryars.

Crown Dream (Majestic Son) won nine races before a foot issue forced him into retirement and then a year after Moonlight Dream followed Andover Hall US colt Dream Mastar, which is also a race winner.

Colleen Fryar said despite annual visits to stud since then Dreamlands Nancy had been unable to leave a foal and at 21 years of age she looked set for a life of retirement at their Moonlight property near Maryborough in Victoria.

"She's a beautiful mare.

"She has great nature," Fryar said.

"She's been wonderful for us."

All up Dreamlands Nancy has left seven winners, including My Dreamweaver NZ (Lindy Lane US), Dreamachiever NZ (Muscle Yankee US) and Our Dreamlover NZ (Love You Fra), a winner of 16 races and earner of \$160,000.

My Dreamweaver has gone on to leave four winners, including My Chimera NZ (Sundon US).

With their first group 1 success under their belt, the Fryars are now looking forward to Royal Dream continuing on the Dreamlands Nancy legacy and of course one day hopefully Moonlight Dream doing the same.

In the meantime though, the Fryars are looking forward to a lot more fun on the track with their star mare.

KEEPING SPARK GOING

SA breeder captures first Victorian group 1

SOUTH AUSTRALIAN BREEDER

Geoff Eason has lived with standardbreds all his life.

He still speaks enthusiastically of Atlantic City – a 1957 Intangible US-Dainty Findon colt bred by his father Charlie – which was as one of South Australia's best young pacers of his year.

And then in the same breath of topliner Glamour Chief – a 1967 Chief Rainbow US-Dainmont colt – which was also bred by his father and went on to run a close third to Hondo Grattan in the 1973 Inter Dominion Championship final at Harold Park.

Dainmont (by Belmont Hall) was a daughter of Dainty Findon.

And it is with his same enthusiasm which caught him up as a teenager that he has greeted his latest track star from his Wyndown Stud operation (a 180ha property which he acquired at One Tree Hill on the outskirts of Adelaide 40 years ago) – Muscle Hill colt Powderkeg.

Easom could hardly have imagined a better start to the young squaregaiter's racing career.

He won an Aldebaran Vicbred Super Series trotting 2yo colts and geldings' heat at Maryborough at his second start and then to Easom's delight the group 1 \$100,000 VSS final at Melton on July 5.

Not normally lost for a word, this is exactly what he was like immediately after the victory.

"I'm speechless.

"This horse's mum is my favourite horse, she's an absolute sweetheart and to get a winner out of her is an absolute bonus," Easom said.

Powderkeg is out of Sparks Ignite, a 2007 Cr Commando-Maori Acacia mare also bred by Easom.

The Powderkeg story all began when Easom, in his late teens, attended the 1966 Inter-Dominion series at Harold Park.

It was there that he laid his eyes on smart trotting mare Maori Miss (Grand Monarch-Yendarra Hall). "She was the best looking mare I's ever seen. Perfect."

Easom said from there he always had a soft spot for the "Maori" breed, something which was of course enhanced by the legendary trotting son of Maori Miss – Maori's Idol (by Ike Frost).

It seemed only a matter of time before Easom would acquire the Maori Miss bloodline as be built his breeding empire

And so it was to be, although not the way he initially planned.

He saw an opportunity when a 1994 Smooth Fella-Maori Trump filly (Maori Acacia) was being offered at a yearling sale in Victoria.

She was the 10th foal of Maori Trump (by Overtrick), an unraced daughter of Maori Miss and of course a half sister of Maori's Idol.

He said he had planned to buy her, but she had the worst knees he had seen on a young horse and did not go through with the purchase.

However, he was to get another opportunity to acquire her three years later at clearing sale when Maori Acacia was offered in foal to Wagon Apollo (by Red Coach Glory) and this time he took it.

Easom handed over \$11,000 and then sold the foal – an impressive looking black filly - for \$10,000.

He said while at the time it seemed like a good business decision, it was a decision he still regreted.

Racing as Skye Rocket, she went on to win 13 races and earn almost \$120,000, and then leave four winners at stud.

However, Maori Acacia was to go on and become a grand producer at stud for Easom.

She was to leave another six winners, including Maori Mischief (by Dream Vacation US) 8 wins, 2009 group SA Trotters' Oaks and SA Trotters' Derby winner Aftanoondelite (by Wagon Apollo) 7 wins and Spark's Ignite, a winner of 10 races and now the mother of Powderkeg.

Maori Acacia had her last foal – a filly by Peak Dink – in 2016.

Easom says with her unable to get in foal since, that is almost certainly the end of her life as a broodmare.

"She's been great."

Powderkeg is Sparks Ignite's second foal, with her first Muscle Hillbilly (also by Muscle Hill) a winner.

She has what is now a two-year-old colt by French-bred side Love You and a yearling filly by Trixton US, with Easom describing the latter as a "lovely" type.

While Powderkeg has been an instant success as a juvenile, Easom believes the Love You colt might need more

I Am Who I Am is a half-sister to winners Gunning (by Majestic Son CA) and Oneoftheclan. (Angus Hall)

From the same family as group 2 winning Prince Eddie (Monarchy US) 15 wins

\$100,000 2YO TROTTING C&G - POWDERKEG



Muscle Hill US-Sparks Ignite (Cr Command US) 2yo colt

Family: Problem NZ Breeder: Wyndown Stud

Powderkeg 's maternal line goes back to legendary Grand Monarch mare Maori Miss – the dam of the great Maori's Idol (by Ike Frost) and matriarch of the "Maori" dynasty.

Sparks Ignite won 10 times and was also group placed, including a third in the 2013 Breed For Speed Gold Series final.

Powderkeg is a full brother to Muscle Hillbilly (3 wins) – the only two foals of Sparks Ignite to race.

Sparks Ignite is out unraced Maori Acacia (Smooth Fella US), which produced eight winners, also including Skye Rocket (13 wins), Maori Mischief (8 wins) and Aftanoondelite (7 wins). Skye Rocket won the 2003 group 1 Victoria Trotters Oaks and group 1 Vicbred Super Series 4yo final.

\$100,000 3YO TROTTING FILLIES - I AM PEGASUS



Pegasus Spur CA-Ginger Gem (Keystone Salute US) 3yo filly

Second winner out Ginger Gem, which also left Abandoned Annie (1 win)

Ginger Gem is out of good producing mare Styx (5 wins) – making her a half-sister to six winners, including topliner group 1 placed River Red (Yentls Image CA) 28 wins, group 1 Victoria Trotters Oaks and group 1 Victoria Trotters Derby winner Zesta (SJs Photo) 13 wins and group 1 placed Nica Macdonon (Eilean Donon) 13 wins.

\$100,000 3YO TROTTING C&G - **KYVALLEY CLICHY**

Angus Hall US-Modern Maori (Sundon US) 3yo colt

Family: Problem NZ Breeders: LN and NJ Pangrazio

This is Kyvalley Cliché's second group 1 win, following Breeders Crown 2yo victory.

He the third winner out of Modern Maori, which has also produced Inittowinit (Majestic Son CA) 1 win and 2016 group 1 Vicbred Super Series 2yo trotting final Needabacardi (Barcardi Lindy US) 5 wins.

Modern Maori is a daughter of Maori Princess (Entrepreneur) 11 wins, great granddaughter of Maori Miss (Grand Monarch) and half-sister to seven winners including 2004 Inter Dominion champion Sumthingaboutmaori (Pine Chip US) 31 wins and \$460,000, Maori Vacation Dream Vacation US) 14 wins and Maori Royal (RCs Dee Jay) 9 wins

Zesta has gone on to be the dam of four winners, including Oceania (Cr Commando US) 13 wins.



\$100,000 4YO TROTTING MARES - **MOONLIGHT DREAM**

Angus Hall US-Dreamlands Nancy US (Pine Chip US) 4yo mare

Family: Kit US Breeders: M Fryar, D Foley

Dreamlands Nancy produced her early progeny in NZ, with her first of seven winning foals being now successful broodmare My Dreamweaver NZ (by Lindy Lane) 4 wins. She has also left group 1 placed and group 2 winner Our Dreamlover (Love You Fra) 16 wins Royal Dream (Monarchy US) and Crown Dream (Majestic Son Ca) 9 wins.

My Dreamweaver had produced four winners, including My Chimera NZ (Sundan) 10 wins



\$100,000 4YO TROTTING E&G - KYVALLEY FINN

Skyvalley NZ-Kyvalley Paris (Majestic Son Ca) 4yo gelding

Family: Polly NZ Breeder: J Connelly

He is the first and only foal of Kyvalley Paris, which was out of unraced Pine Chip US mare Cashel Dagha US.

Cashal Dagha has had four winning foals, also including multiple group 1 placed Kyvalley Boomerang (by Skyvalley) 14 wins, Kyvalley Roy (bSJ's Photo) 9 wins, Kyvalley Topcat (by Skyvalley) 7 wins and Flash Kyvalley (Skyvalley) 6 wins).

Cashal Dagha is a full sister to Cashel Epona NZ (3 wins), and half sister to Kyvalley Races (Majestic Son) 7 wins, Kyvalley Pink (Eilean Donon) 6 wins and Cheque Again (Wagon Apollo) 6 wins.

The maternal family also features group 1 placed Chiola Cola NZ (Chiola Hanover US) 18 wins, 363,000, and Indette (Boyden Hanover US) 21 wins



\$130,000 2YO PACING FILLIES - MAAJIDA



Somewheresomebeach US-Arterial Way (Art Major US) 2yo filly

Family: Peri NZ Breeder: GR, IG, LJ and SJ Johnson

Maajida is a full brother to Lifeonthebeach (7 wins), and half sister to We Salute You (by Well Said US) 8 wins and Manuela (Rocknroll Hanover US)

Arterial Way won 6 races and one of nine winners out of Better Motoring NZ (New York Motoring US) 13 wins, which also include Virage (Holmes Hanover US) 21 wins and \$158,000, Points North (Holmes Hanover US) 17 wins, Motor Holmes (Holmes Hanover US) 16 wins, 2009 group 1 NSW Breeders 3yo final New York Fashion (Falcon Seelster US) 15 wins and \$173,000, and Cashiskin (Falcon Seelster (US) 12 wins.

Beter Motoring is a half sister of Better Bet (Caprock US) 8 wins and Yette (Caprock US) 8 wins.

Somebeachsomewhere US-Pride Kept Me (Safely Kept US) 2yo colt

Family: Jessie Saunders Breeder: R Hasty

Yejele Hammer is third winner from as many foals out of Pride Kept Me

He is a half-brother to Fullness Of Time (by Art Major) 10 wins and Siedra Caleb (Art Major) 3 wins.

Pride Kept Me (4 wins) is out of prolific producing broodmare Lauricks Pride (Dale's Gift), which had 14 winning foals in a stud career spanning more than two decades from the early 1980s.

Group 3 winner Robric Jonboy (Walton Hanover US) led the way of her progeny with 30 wins and \$242,000, followed by group1 placed Her Sparky Self (Exotic Earl) 26 wins and \$221,000, multiple country cups winner Send Me A Dream (Sandman Hanover) 23 wins and \$163,000, and Robyns Boy (Muckalee Strike US) 18 wins and \$102,000.

Art Major US-Play Ball (Presidential Ball US) 3yo colt

Play Ball (1 win) is out of group 1 placed Secret Life (by Safely Kept) the dam of seven winners including 2012 group 1 Victoria Oaks winner Beauty Secret (Armbro Operative US) 24 wins and \$425,000, and 2013 group 1 Vicbred Super Series 2yo final winner and 2014 group 1 NSW Derby winner Major Secret (Art Major) 22 wins and \$464,000.

Beauty Secret has gone onto produced three winners, including Striking Beauty (Art Major) 11 wins.

Lifeline is a daughter of Lifeline (Classic Garry) and broodmare Larrakeyah Lady (Windshield Wiper US), which left nine winners including 1999 group 1 Australian Pacing Championship winner and 2002 group 1 Hunter Cup winner Safe and Sound (Safely Sound), which also went on to be a successful sire after 33 wins and earning

Larrakeyah Lady was also the dam of Safeguard (Safely Kept US) 29 wins, Massarua (Armbro Operative US) 42 wins and \$282,000, and Gold Rocket (Armbro Operative) 36 wins and \$393,000

Lifeline also left multiple group winner Lovelist (Always A Virgin US) 18 wins, \$222,000.

\$130,000 3YO PACING FILLIES - KUALOA

Art Major US-Hawaiian Hottie US (American Ideal US) 3yo filly

Family: Dolly B US Breeder: BC and VA Edward

Hawaiian Hottie (2 wins) has left four winners from four foals to race.

These also feature Makoa (Art Major) 13 wins, and group 1 placed Jemstone (Bettors Delight US) 5 wins.

Hawaiian Hottie is half sister to Artesian US (Artiscape), which after winning 12 races and earning \$987,000 has sired more than 200

His progeny include 2010 group 1 Vicbred Super Series 3yo winner, 2011 group 1 VSS 4yo final winner and 2014 group 1 Fremantle Cup winner David Hercules (39 wins, \$1,263,000)



\$130,000 4YO PACING MARES - PISTOL ABBEY

Western Terror- US-Art Princess (Art Major) 4yo mare

Breeder: MB Sandholm

Family: Bessie B NZ

Half-sister to winners Benevolence (American Ideal US) and Yourshoutrocky (Bettors Delight US)

Multiple group 1 placed group 1 Art Princess won 14 times.

She is a daughter of The Kindly One (Praised Dignity US) 8 wins, which has produced nine winners, including Cullens Hope (Christian Cullen NZ) 22 wins, Major Fury (Art Major) 10 wins, The Aussie (Art Major) 9 wins, and Kinda Blessed (Christian Cullen NZ) 6 wins.



\$130,000 4YO PACING E&G - **TAM MAJOR**

Art Major US-Magic Z Tam US (Camluck US) 4yo colt

Family: Aileen US Breeders: BC and VA Edward

Tam Major is the second Australian foal of Magic Z Tam (27 wins), being a full brother to All Star Magician (7 wins).

Magic Z Tam is a daughter of Life Sign mare Life Cycle US ($5\ wins,$ \$377,000), which has also produced Winslow Gambler US 1:52.2 and \$284,000, Cardholder US 1:53.2 and \$232,000, and DCs Better Life 1:53.2 among others in a prolific winning family.









NORTHERN RIVERS EXPANDS

Embracing all aspects of equine world

A RAFT OF NEW FACILITIES, INCREASED ACREAGE,

a new growth-monitoring program and the addition of two world class stallions.

That is the incentive for broodmare owners patronising Northern Rivers Equine Veterinary Clinic at Kyabram in the heart of the Goulburn Valley.

Founded by Dr Kath McIntosh in July, 2009, Northern Rivers, which was originally set up on the 80-acre home block, has been developed into one of the most up-to-date breeding nurseries in the country and now covering 510 acres

New improvements include a 16mx 46m barn comprising 16 horse boxes, feed room, tack room, wash down area and tie-up stalls.

A smaller barn dedicated solely for stallion collection and a Magnum Equine eight-horse monorail walker are other important additions to the facility.

McIntosh said the horse boxes and equine walker would be used primarily for the preparation of yearlings.

"We'll also use it for rehabilitation of a variety of equine athletes and managing some of our broodmares," she said.

The second barn houses a purpose-built laboratory, feed room and dedicated stallion paddocks to meet government quarantine restrictions.

"The wet lab is designed for the collection of semen, while the second section will be utilised for processing and analysing the semen and readying it for packaging and distribution around Australia and New Zealand. It's all temperature controlled with strict bio-security controls," McIntosh said.

With the expected increase in horse numbers in the 2019-20 stud season, Northern Rivers has acquired a 400-acre property 10 minutes from the home farm.

"We will utilise the new property to grow most of the hay," McIntosh said.

"We are already able to produce enough hay for 12 months at a time, but we'll be carrying more horses so we'll need more hay. Once the mares have weaned their foals the dry mares will be agisted in the bigger paddocks out there and it will give the home property a chance to spell.

"We'll keep the young stock here on the home block."

The stallion line-up features the return of Yankee Rockstar, and the addition of champion sire American Ideal and former world champion racehorse Mel Mara.

American Ideal, a 1:47.8, \$855,928 winning son of the great Western Ideal, has been among the top bracket of sires in America, New Zealand and Australia for the past decade.

The sire of the winners of more than \$110-million, American Ideal has left 11 millionaires including horses the calibre of Bling It On, Soho Tribeca, My Hard Copy, Ideal Scott and The Orange Agent and talented young pacers such as Centenario, Miss Halfpenny and Pelosi.

Mel Mara, who took a record of 1:47, paced two winning miles inside 1:48 and earned \$1,028,397, is one of the fastest horses ever imported Down Under.

A son of champion pacer Lis Mara and from the immediate family of influential sire No Nukes, the handsome young stallion, which is lining up for his first season at stud, claimed the scalps of superstars Sweet Lou, Always B Miki, McWicked and Foiled Again during his racetrack career.

Yankee Rockstar is standing his second season at Northern Rivers after serving 50 mares in his introductory year. With the continued superb performance of the dam Aston Villa's progeny on the track this year, Yankee Rockstar is a great way to access such a top performing family and pedigree.

Another new initiative for Northern Rivers this year is Gro-Trac, an equine nutrition program devised to gauge the growth and weight of young stock and broodmares.

McIntosh said Dr Peter Huntington, of Kentucky Equine Research provided advice about nutrition options for the younger stock as well as the stallions and mares to make sure that they had the nutrition correct for every stage of the horse's development.

"The program also enables us to provide more information to our clients. We will weigh and monitor the growth rates of the foals all the way through to yearlings and if there's any changes or perhaps some stock are not growing at the same rate as the others, then we can adapt or feed specifically.

"Given that we are preparing yearlings for the sales for clients we want the buyers of our yearlings to feel confident in the product that they're buying. "The information that we are generating over the lifetime of that horse is important to demonstrate for future buyers that the quality of product they are going to get is above and beyond just the pedigree on the page."

The Northern Rivers team also features veterinarians Ashley Greeves, Alison Greaves and Meagan Thomas, office manager Hollie Sheehan and stallion manager Josh Taylor servicing clients with standardbreds, thoroughbreds and quarter horses.

McIntosh said veterinary clinic provided state-of-the-art veterinary services on-site for the horses on-farm.

."We also have a 24-hour full ambulatory service to clients away from the clinic and people can bring their horses directly to the clinic as well. We are not just about breeding.

"On-farm our services include foaling down the mares, weaning and handling the young stock, yearling preparation, spelling, breeding using frozen and chilled semen as well as embryo transfer with our own recipient herd."

Kath McIntosh has a genuine interest in the harness racing industry. She owns a few weanlings, has obtained a trial driver's licence and is a Harness Breeders Victoria committee member.

"In a time when things in the industry are being seen in a negative light, we are positive about the future and confident about the level of service that we can provide.

"We try to do things a little bit differently, changing things up a bit to create a bit more an advantage for our clients in the marketplace, get excellent results and to do so in a professional manner," McIntosh said.

ARRIVALS Eight new stallions for Downunder

THE QUANTITY OF NEW STALLIONS

available to breeders in Australia this year might be an all-time low, but the lack of numbers is more than compensated by the quality of the imports.

Eight stallions will stand their first season down under in 2019-20 - five pacers and three trotters. Of these only former Kiwi superstar Lazarus, world champion Mel Mara, the royally bred Rock N Roll World and European Grand Circuit trotter Volstead will be here in the flesh.

The remaining quartet – pacers Luck Be Withyou and Helpisontheway, and champion trotters Tactical Landing and Up And Quick – are accessible via frozen semen.

Lazarus is slated to stand his first southern hemisphere season at Yirribee Pacing Stud, Wagga; Mel Mara is lining up for his initial season at Northern Rivers Equine Veterinary Clinic, Kyabram; Rock N Roll World will stand at Allwood Stud, Bullsbrook, WA; and Volstead will be located at Haras des Trotteurs' Ballarat farm.

Tactical Landing, the fastest son of the great Muscle Hill, is part of the Stallions Australasia sires' roster, while the frozen semen sires of Up And Quick, Luck Be Withyou and Helpisontheway are all available from Niota Bloodstock near Shepparton.

LAZARUS

Unquestionably the headline act among the new brigade is the mighty Lazarus, whose lifetime stakes tally of \$4,125,988 ranks him as the richest standardbred stallion in history to stand stud anywhere in the world.

Named New Zealand Horse of the Year twice, 3yo, 4yo and Aged Pacer of the Year, and Australian Horse of the Year, as well as a dual Australasian Grand Circuit Champion, Lazarus met and defeated the best horses in four countries - winning 37 of his 51 starts.

The mighty son of Bettor's Delight was a 15-time winner at

group 1 level, established five track records in NZ and a further three in Australia and he paced seven miles in 1:50 or better. He took his lifetime mark of 1:48.4 winning the \$177,000 Hoosier Park Pacing Derby and was race-timed in 1:46.6 after sitting parked at The Red Mile.

Lazarus won the NZ Cup twice, Inter Dominion, A.G. Hunter Cup in track record time, Victoria Cup, NZ, Great Northern and Victoria Derbies, Harness Jewels in Australasian record time, NZ Sires Stakes 3yo Championship and Chariots Of Fire.

TACTICAL LANDING

Boasting a lifetime record of 1:50.4, Tactical Landing is the fastest ever son of former champion racehorse and sire and now a leading sire of sires, Muscle Hill.

The winner of \$812,300 from only 16 starts, Tactical Landing has a real Breeders Crown pedigree; not only was he a Breeders Crown champion himself but he was sired by a dual Breeders Crown champion in Muscle Hill, his dam, Southwind Serena was a Breeders Crown winner and his full sister Mission Brief was a Breeders Crown champion.

Besides his Breeders Crown triumph, Tactical Landing captured a leg of the time-honoured Kentucky Futurity and finished second in the Final in a world record 1:50, a division of the Bluegrass Stake, an elimination of the Hambletonian (third in final) and the \$350,000 TVG Championship.

An \$800,000 yearling, Tactical Landing lacks nothing on the score of blood. His dam, Southwind Serena, a daughter of the great Varenne, also produced the dual world champion and USA 2yo and 3yo Trotting Filly of the Year Mission Brief (\$1.5 million), while his granddam, Spice On Ice, was the second dam of the Kentucky Futurity winner Ice Attraction and the Canadian 2yo Filly Trotter of the Year The Ice Dutchess.



NEW STALLIONS FOR DOWNUNDER

NEW STALLIONS FOR DOWNUNDER

ROCK N ROLL WORLD

Bred on a classic cross of blood – being by Rocknroll Hanover out of an Artsplace mare - Rock N Roll World is without doubt one of the best bred and performed stallions ever to stand stud in this country.

In a nutshell, Rock N Roll World is by a champion sire out of a champion racemare, who is a sister to a champion racehorse and sire. His dam, Worldly Beauty (1:49.6 and \$1,900,255), the USA 2yo and 3yo filly of her year, was a full sister to the dam of champion colt pacer and last year's leading USA 2yo sire Captaintreacherous (1:47.2 and \$3,148,657).

Furthermore, Rock N Roll World ranks as a full brother to the multiple stakes winner and now 1:50 sire World Of Rocknroll (1:50.6 and \$338,561) and belongs to the immediate family of successful sires such as Art Major, Western Ideal, American Ideal, Real Artist and Perfect Art.

Rock N Roll World displayed brilliant speed and stamina, winning on half-mile, five-eighths and mile tracks in Stakes and Invitational company from two to five years and, in all, he won 18 races with 27 placings for \$712,737 in stakes.

VOLSTEAD

A Swedish group 1-winning stallion, Volstead went 1:51.5 on a 1000 metretrack, will join the stallion strength at Haras Des Trotteurs at Cardigan near Ballarat.

The beautifully American-bred stallion will be the first son of Cantab Hall, a leading sire of sires, to be available as a chilled semen option in the Southern Hemisphere.

An outstanding competitor in Sweden's elite gold division, Volstead raced out of the top Swedish barn of Stefan Melander and won 23 of his 72 race starts including the group 1 King's Cup and the prestigious Sweden Cup, or Little Elitlopp, in 2015.

He qualified for the Elitloppet the following year where he just missed out on the final (won by his stablemate Nuncio) and was also an unlucky second to Nuncio in the group 1 Swedish Sprint Masters, after sitting parked the whole race, getting to the front in the shadows of the post only for his stablemate to come off his back and nab him on the line.

"Volstead was very fast from the beginning when we started training him and was a very very strong horse," Melander said.



"Volstead could race on the outside the whole race. If it was a distance race or a mile race, it didn't matter and he could still win racing outside the entire race."

Melander bought Volstead as a yearling because of his great conformation and excellent pedigree (by Cantab Hall from a Yankee Glide mare) with a tremendous number of stakes winners and racehorses, he said.

"I have retained breedings to breed my own mares in USA as I can see Volstead within the next five years becoming highly successful and one of the top trotting stallions in the world," Melander said.

Volstead will stand for a fee \$5500 (GST inclusive) in Australia and \$NZ5,000 plus GST in New Zealand.

UP AND QUICK

Up And Quick, a French-based dual world champion, has been one of Europe's most outstanding trotters in the last decade.

The winner of \$3.6million, the son of the legendary Buvetier D'Anou won five races at group 1 level in France including the prestigious Prix d'Amerique in 2015 and the Grand Prix de Paris in 2014 and 2015, and set world records of 1:51.6 for 1609 metres and 1:55 for 3000 metres.

In his Prix d'Amerique triumph, Up And Quick sat parked most of the way before easily accounting for Europe's best trotters in a 1:56.1 mile rate over 2700 metres – only 0.4 outside the race record.

MEL MARA

Mel Mara (1:47 and \$1,028,397) was a world champion racehorse which paced 15 winning sub-1:50 miles, and is regarded as one of America's top free-for-allers in recent times.

He took his record of 1:47 at The Meadowlands, defeating the two fastest horses in history, Always B Miki and McWicked - equalling the world record for an older pacing stallion on a mile track in the process.

Among his other successes were the \$130,000 Ontario Sires Stakes Gold Series 3yo Final, a division of the Bluegrass Stakes at The Red Mile and two eliminations of the Ben Franklin Pace.

A commanding individual of 16 hands and foaled in 2009, Mel Mara is the fastest and richest son of former champion pacer Lis Mara and is a member of one of America's greatest families – that tracing to Jessie Pepper – a tribe noted for producing top racehorses and leading sires.



LUCK BE WITHYOU

Luck Be Withyou is a \$1.45-million winning son of Western Ideal and a member of the prolific Three Diamonds tribe. He was a brilliant pacing colt, which later competed with real distinction in free-for-all company.

As a 2yo he captured the \$500,000 Breeders Crown in 1:52 and the Champlain Stake, at three he won an elimination of the Messenger and finished second in the final, while at four he led from end-to-end in the \$500,000 Ben Franklin Pace in 1:49.

Luck Be Withyou took his record of 1:47.8 winning the \$75,000 Ben Franklin Consolation at Pocono Downs' five furlongs track as a five-year-old.

Upon his retirement, Luck Be Withyou entered stud at Maple Lane Farm, Indiana where he served 136 mares in his initial season in 2018 at a fee of \$US4,000.

NZ-BRED YOUNGSTERS STEAL LIMELIGHT

LITTLE DID LEX AND HEATHER WILLIAMS KNOW

the magnitude of the journey they were about to embark on when trainer Phil Williamson picked out a yearling filly for them in 2003.

Only the third horse they had purchased, the Williams outlayed \$23,000 for the daughter of United States champion trotting sire Sundon and Frances Jay Bee NZ.

The filly was One Over Kenny and she went to be one of Australasia's all-time great trotters – winning 32 of 66 starts on either side of the Tasman and topping \$1m in earnings.

It did not stop there.

The two-time Rowe Cup winner has gone on to be a great broodmare for the Williams, producing six winners.

Majestic Son colt One Over Da Moon is the best so far.

He won 22 races for almost \$370,00 in earnings, with his victories including the 2013 group 1 Harness Jewels 2yo Ruby Trot on his way to being named the NZ 2yo trotter of the year.

One Over Kenny now looks to have an heir apparent to the first of her foals

Ultimate Stride, a son of champion French-bred sire Love You, took a giant step in that direction with victory in the group 1 \$50,000 Volstead Redwood 2yo Trotters' Classic at Maryborough on August 4.

Trained by Phil Williamson and driven by Anthony Butt, Ultimate Stride is raced by Emilio and Maria Rosati, who paid \$160,000 for the fifth foal of One Over Kenny at the 2018NZ premier yearling sales.

The Redwood Classic was Ultimate Stride's fourth career win in eight starts and second from as many outings in Australia.

His wins also include the listed PGG Wrightson NZ Yearling Sales 2yo Trot at Addington.

Ultimate Stride was part of a domination by NZ-bred youngsters on Redwood Day, with Majestic Son gelding Majestuoso taking out the group 1 \$75,000 Haras Des Trotteurs Victoria Trotters' Derby.

Bred by Alabar NZ, Majestuoso is raced by Norm Jenkin and trained by Andy Gath in Victoria.

He is out of Monarchy mare Rosemaryz Luck, which has left two winners.
