HAVING A COOL TIME

WINNERS KEEP COMING AT ALL LEVELS

DARYLL WEGMANN KNOWS ALL ABOUT

breeding and racing pacers and trotters which have gone to the top.

In four decades the Goulburn Valley standardbred enthusiast has just about lost count of the winners to come out of his breeding nursery, although he can name just about every one.

As exciting and satisfying as taking out the big features is, Wegmann enjoys every winner – no matter what the class, where or when.

Carter Mayson provided proof of this when the son of Auckland Reactor scored in the Harness Breeders Victoria 3yo Vicbred Maiden Pace on Humbletonian Day at Maryborough on August 29.

Adding to the delight is that Carter Mayson is named after one of Wegmann's grandsons.

Wegmann and his wife Susan have been keen to ensure their family is involved as much as possible in their harness racing pursuits, with the naming of horses after their grandchildren one way of doing this.

Carter Mayson's breakthrough is yet another chapter in the remarkable success of the family of Wegmann's foundation mare She's Cool – the great granddam of the three-year-old.

Bred by Brian Rossiter from the neighbouring breeding nursery of Alabar Farms, Wegmann initially acquired the 1986 daughter of Glen Almahurst US and Kiwi's Lady (by Out To Win US) as a racing proposition.

Unfortunately a paddock mishap left her blind in one eye.

And then after later being seen bumping into fences, it was discovered she was also almost blind in her other

While racing was out of the question, she took to the breeding barn like a natural.

Wegmann described her as a great mare and a great

mother, with no greater example of the latter than the way she had managed after losing an eye all together.

He said she coped really well with the disability, as had her foals, which were often seen leading their mother.

She's Cool had 13 foals to the races, with 10 getting into the winners' circle.

Group 1-placed Aleppo Lady (Safely Kept US) was the most successful with 13 wins and going 1:57.9 in earning \$80,000.

It would be through several of her other daughters as broodmares that She's Cool would leave her biggest mark.

Shes Our Angel (Classic Garry) produced 10 winners, including group 3 winner Sky Tower (Panorama US) 36 wins, \$241,000; Nightn Georgia (Safely Kept US) 11 wins, \$116,000; listed winner Kasey

John (Bettors Delight US) 11 wins, \$104,000; Shower Of Roses (Albert Albert US) 8 wins; group 1 placed Jasmin Amal (Sportswriter US) 8 wins, \$101,000; Debutante Ball (Presidential Ball US) 8 wins; Keeper Of Keys (Grinfromeartoear US) 7 wins, \$60,000; and Nightn Zante (What's Next US) 7 wins.

Continuing this line, Nightn Georgia's progeny features Soho Eros (Artiscape US) 19 wins, \$73,000; and Rocknrolla (Grinfromeartoear US) 12 wins, \$287,000, and now the dam of group 3 winner Somerocksomeroll (Somebeachsomewhere US) 8 wins; and group 3 placed Bettorockbettorroll (5 wins).

Shower Roses has left Reign Of Fear (Western Terror) 1:53.2, 17 wins, \$127,000; and Reign Of Pain (Armbro Operative) 1:55.3, 13 wins, \$130,000.

It has not only been She's Cool's successful racemares which have continued the family name in the breeding barn.

Insulated (Safely Kept US) 5 wins and the unraced Heaven (Victory Sarnel) have left a huge mark on Wegmann's breeding empire.

Insulated had the distinction of a being a trotter - as Wegmann says she "broke the mould" - and has left progeny of both pacing and trotting gaits, including multiple group 1 placed trotters Aleppo Sunrise (Sundon US) 16 wins, \$204,000, Aleppo Midas (Sundon US) 16 wins, \$142,000; Aleppo Jewel (Angus Hall US) 9 wins, \$107,000; and Aleppo Murphy (Sundon US) 8 wins, \$56,000.

Insulated's daughters have also had success ad stud, with Aleppo Heiress (Armbro Operative US) 4 wins, producing group 1 placed pacer Fourbigmen (Mach Three Ca) 8 wins, \$96,000; and Aleppo Midas leaving two-time group 1 trotter Alpha Male (Majestic Son Ca).

Heaven is producing a dynasty in her own right as the dam of eight winners, including Safe Decision (Safely Kept US) 17 wins, \$90,000; Golden Zeus (Golden Greek) 13 wins, \$39,000; Panorama Drive (Panorama US) 13 wins, \$67,000; two-time group 1 placed Dreams Of Heaven (Safely Kept US) 13 wins, \$150,000; Might Jasper (Village Jasper US) 7 wins, \$37,000; and Schouten Island (Art Major US) 6 wins, \$43,000.

As her record suggests Dreams of Heaven provided plenty of enjoyment for all on the track, but her stud career has taken her to a whole new level – primarily to date as the dam of the outstanding Menin Gate.

The son of Somebeachsomewhere took all before him on the track, winning the 2015 Victoria Derby, Vicbred Super

Series 3yo final, Queensland Derby and Breeders Crow 3yo final in an extraordinary season which was part of a career which reaped 16 wins and \$574,000.

Her other foals to the races have been the untapped Soho Rockefeller (Art Major), which won 3 of only 5 starts, and group 3 placed Millah Joy (Bettors Delight US) 4 wins, \$39,000, which has been racing in close to career-best form.

Wegmann said they had been overjoyed with what Dreams Of Heaven had achieved at stud, with more to come.

Not surprising, given a Dreams Of Heaven colt by Somebeachsomewhere sold for \$90,000 at this year's Australian Pacing Gold sale in Melbourne.

What will be of interest next will be the interest a yearling colt by Rock N Roll Heaven produces this season.

Over the years Wegmann has reduced his racing and breeding stock.

As well as Dreams Of Heavens, his broodmare stock include Royal Jinx (Sokys Atom US) and Elegant Art (Art Major US) –daughters of Shes Elegant and great granddaughter of She's Cool – and unraced Angel Spirit (Presidential Ball US) – a daughter of Shes Our Angel.

While his numbers are few, Wegmann's enthusiasm has not waned, describing himself as a keen student of pedigree.

There can be no doubt, there is plenty more to come from the Wegmann breeding barn.

The Lombo Standardbreds-bred Queena Harts Lombo is the second foal out of Lombo Regalia (by Jet Laag US). Queena Harts Lombo had seven minor placings in her racing career and has had two offspring to the races, with Pickpocket (Lombo Pocket Watch) having 2 wins.

Lombo Regalia (7 wins) has produced four winners, including group 3 winner Adam Cartwright (Ponder US) 18 wins and \$157,000

The family also includes Trunkey Jaguar (Tarcoola Frost) 26 wins, \$142,000; Ferrari Trunkey (Tarcoola Frost) 22 wins, \$267,000; and Trunkey Limousine (Tarcoola Frost) 13 wins, \$57,000.

Angel Spirit is a daughter of Shes Our Angel (Classic Garry) 4 wins, which is the dam of 10 winners, including group 3 winner Sky Tower (Panorama US) 36 wins, \$241,000; Kasey John (Bettors Delight US) 11 wins, \$104,000; Nightn Georgia (Safely Kept) 11 wins, \$116,000; Jasmin Amal (Sportswriter US) 8 wins, \$101,000; Shower of Roses (Albert

Albert US) 8 wins; Debutant Ball (Presidential Ball US) 8 wins; Nightn Zanta (Whats Next US) 7 wins; and Keeper of Keys (Grinfromeartoear US) 7 wins.

HBV 2YO VICBRED MAIDEN TROT - ILLAWONG STARDUST

Illawong Stardust is yet another young squaregaiter continuing on the great "Maori" family line, being a great great great geat granddaughter of legendary broodmare Maori Miss (by Grand Monarch) – the dam of all-time great Maori's Idol (Ike Frost).

Lunar Landing only saw the racetrack once, but has left her mark at stud, leaving five winners with Spidergirl (Yankee Spider US) and Illawong Armstrong (Majestic Son Ca) the stand-outs.

Spidergirl completed the group 1 Vicbred Super Series trotting championship triple crown as a 2yo, 3yo and 4yo among 20 career wins for \$317,000. Illawong Armstrong (18 wins, \$221,000) is also a group 1 winner

Lunar Landing is a daughter of unraced Maorimoon (Entrepreneur US) and a half-sister to group 1 Vicbred Super Series 2yo trotting winner Master Maori (Extrovert US) 26 wins, \$203,000; and Tricky Interest (SJs Photo US) 14 wins.

Jerulas Shadow is an unraced mare which has produced four foals for four winners, also including Machin Tyme (by Mach Three Ca) 2 wins; Iron Mach (Mach Three Ca) 2 wins; and Hidden Figure (Mach Three Ca) 1 win

She is a half-sister to eight winners, including My Turnberry (NZ (Ok Bye US) 20 wins, \$86,000; Primetime (Ok By US) 20 wins, \$61,000; and Woodlea Reigns NZ (Badlands Hanover US) 11 wins, \$72,000.

The maternal line also featured 1985 Inter Dominion heat winner, 1985 Melbourne Pacing Cup and 1984 Geelong Pacing Cup winner Panyan (Nardins Byrd US) 29 wins, \$176,000.

Allshookup is the only foal of Ballanbella Baby (11 wins and \$84,000) to have raced.

Ballanbella Baby is one of eight winners out of Teen Talk (by Safely Kept) 5 wins, with her other progeny featuring Gettysburg Address (Presidential Ball US) 17 wins, \$99,000; Whosthatchick (Ultimate Falcon US) 7 wins; and Party Rocka (In The Pocket US) 5 wins.

Other family members include Teen Talk's half brother, Victoria Sires Classic winner Locked Away (Safely Kept US-Save Your Kisses) and Hes Kinky (Safely Kept US-Fetish) 11 wins. Fetish (Booth Hanover US) is a half-sister to Save Your Kisses and champion broodmare Larrakeyah Lady (Windshield Wiper), which produced nine winners including group 1 AG Hunter Cup winner Safe And Sound (Safely Kept US) 33 wins, \$995,000.

Speed Dating is the second foal out of Chick At The Bar to race and win, following in the footsteps of listed Vicbred Super Series Silver 2yo fillies' final winner Pick Up Line (by Four Starzzz Shark Ca) 4 wins.

Chick At The Bar is one two winners produced by In The Bar (Keystone Scotch US) 7 wins. Her other foal to race is Pacific Raider (Pacific Fella US) 8 wins.

The family also includes Classic Beau (Keystone Scotch US) 22 wins, \$92,000.

Andrea Hayley won only once and Missus Matilda is her only foal to get to the races. She has had two foals – \sin seasons apart.

Andrew Hayley is out of the well-performed Family Cruise (by Armbro Aussie US) 10 wins, \$30,000, which had four winners from five foals to races. These also included Roslei Hilda (Exotic Earl US) 11 wins and Blended Family (Armbro Operative US) 8 wins.

Family Cruise's dam is Family Dame (Kotare Knight) 10 wins, and granddam Family Credit (Meadow Paige US) 17 wins, \$90,000.

Scott Belmont mare Credit Funds left 1981 Galax Grand Slam 3yo fillies' final runner-up Family Credit, Family First (Atashy US) 16 wins, Family Asset (Tyros Hanover US) 5 wins and Family Red (Tyros Hanover) wins, is a successful stud career in Tasmania.

Family Asset in turn produced nine winners and is the granddam of Make Waves (Beach Towel US) 20 wins, \$149,000; and Eachway (Bookmaker US) 12 wins, \$52,000.

Family Credit left seven winners, including Family Arm (Armbro Aussie US) 18 wins, \$85,000 and Family Way (Hilarious Way US) 16 wins, \$91,000.

HBV 3YO VICBRED MAIDEN TROT - DANCES



Bacardi Lindy US-Im Tina Turner (NZ (Chiola Cola NZ) 3yo filly

Dances is the only foal of Im Tina Turner (late Tina Turner), 8 wins, to have raced.

Im Tina Turner is out of Sundown NZ (Sundon US) – making her a full sister to Its Big Time Baby NZ (9 wins) and Chiola Sunset NZ (1 win).

Sundown is a full sister to Classic Comment (18 wins, \$80,000), each being out of Aron Del Nz (Hokin Andy US) 11 wins, \$11,000.

money-winning sire for the eighth year in a row.

His progeny banked a record \$13.6 million in 2018-19, more than \$3.5 million ahead of runner-up Art Major on \$10m.

The deceased Mach Three (\$6.4 m), Somebeachsomewhere (\$4.7 m) and Rock N Roll Heaven (\$4.4 m) rounded out the top five.

Bettor's Delight topped the all-aged list in every category – stakemoney, winners and races won.

The Woodlands Stud flagship was also the leading sire of two and three-year-olds

Alabar Bloodstock's Majestic Son headed the trotting sire list for the fourth year on end with a record progeny earnings of \$1.9 million. He also captured the three-year-old title and was runner-up to Andover Hall in the two-year-old premiership.

The biggest contributor to Bettor's Delight tally was Tiger Tara NZ, Australia's undisputed champion pacer in 2018-19 with successes in the Inter Dominion grand final and A.G. Hunter and Victoria Cups for earnings of \$865,500.

Miracle Mile winner Spankem NZ (\$692,900), Breeders Crown champion and dual derby winner Max Delight (\$299,310), Ballarat Pacing Cup winner Thefixer NZ (\$281,400) and top youngster Jilliby Nitro (\$246,595) were among his best horses last season.

Art Major, which sired a record 102 individual three-year-old winners, was represented by Fremantle Cup winner My Field Marshal NZ (\$274,500) and star three-year-olds Our Princess Tiffany NZ (\$248,862), Major Trojan NZ (\$180,304), Kualoa (\$148,850), Malcoms Rhythm (\$141,540) and Out To Play (\$125,005).

Majestic Son, which topped the trotting sires' list, produced a string of classic winners headed up by Majestuoso (Victoria Derby), Breeders Crown champions Majestic Player, Kratos NZ and Moonshine Linda, Royal Charlotte (Victoria and NSW Oaks), and the Need For Speed and Home Grown Classic winner Alpha Male.

Legendary New Zealand pacer Christian Cullen, which stood almost his entire stud career in NZ, headed the Australian broodmare sire list for the fourth year on end. His daughters left 258 winners of 682 races and earnings of \$7.1 million including cup class pacers Thefixer NZ, Chicago Bull NZ and Wrappers Delight.

Holmes Hanover, which topped the broodmare sire list on seven occasions, finished runner-up with \$4.1 million, followed by Art Major (\$4 million), the leading broodmare sire of two and three-year-olds.

Sundon again headed the trotting broodmare sire section for the ninth consecutive season. His daughters produced the winners of \$2.9 million including the champion Tornado Valley, Ultimate Stride (Breeders Crown 2YO), Kyvalley Clichy (Vicbred 3YO) and Royal Charlotte.

First crop sire Hurrikane Kingcole, which stands at Egmont Park stud near Brisbane, topped the two-year-old percentage sire list with a 40 percent winners-to-foals ratio. He left 14 winners from a foal crop of just 34 including the Victoria Youthful Stakes and Vicbred Silver winner Youaremy Sunshine and the group 1 and listed placegetters Our Balou, Venus Jujon and Xaviers Hurrikane.

Meanwhile, Mach Three headed the three-year-old percentage table with 43 winners from Australian-bred 83 foals, a remarkable 51.8 strike rate. Hardhitter, a NSW Breeders Challenge placegetter and dual derby finalist, Vicbred final placegetter Fourbigmen and Bathurst Gold Chalice runner-up College Chapel were among the best of Mach Three's three-year-old crop last season.



SPEEDING SPUR AND LA GRANGE IN US

DOWNUNDER BLOODLINES ARE MAKING

their presence felt in trotting ranks in North America through two relative newcomers.

Former New Zealand star Speeding Spur and emerging Australian export La Grange are proving ones to watch.

Although he did not win the Maple Leaf Trot at Woodbine Mohawk Park at the end of August, Speeding Spur (driven by Jody Jamieson) rallied from seventh to fifth in the stretch behind winner Guardian Angel AS.

He was individually timed in 1:51.6.

The \$600,000 Maple Leaf Trot is Canada's biggest race for three-year-old and older trotters.

It often attracts overseas runners, although they tend to be European horses.

New Zealand champion Lyell Creek (1:52.4m; \$1,436,952) finished second in a 2001 elimination behind eventual Maple Leaf Trot champion Plesac. Despite drawing the pole in the final, "Creek the Freak" ended up ninth. In 2002, under new trainer Brett Pelling, Lyell Creek was fifth. The gelded son of Roydon Glen-Kahlum (by Noodlum) made a lasting impression in North America after competing in Sweden, Denmark, and Norway in 2001.

In 2003, Supreme Pat finished fifth in his Maple Leaf Trot elimination for trainer Jerry Silverman. In the final, the gelding broke stride late, ending up ninth. Supreme Pat (1:54.6m; \$288,600) was by Sundon, out of Young Pat by Pernod Eden - a pedigree that raised more wonderment than recognition in the US and Canada.

Speeding Spur was the first Southern Hemisphere runner in the Maple Leaf Trot since 2003. He was third (individually timed in 1:53 flat) in his elimination behind the pair which would finish one-two in the final - Guardian Angel and last year's Hambletonian winner Atlanta. He went to finish fifth in the final.

The multiple Australian Group 1-winning stallion was bred by Woodlands Stud, NZ. He is by Pegasus Spur, out of the Chiola Hanover mare Dellas Speed - a pedigree filled with horses of North American lineage. This mare's other two foals are fillies Sueno (Dream Vacation) and Silver Spur (Pegasus Spur).

Aussie-bred stallion La Grange (1:54.2, \$117,163) has attracted attention since arriving in the stable of Per Engblom in February. With a pair of group 2 victories in two seasons of Australian competition, the Yabby Dam Farms-bred entire finished third in a preferred event at The Red Mile in Lexington, Kentucky, where he was individually clocked in 1:52.8. He is now trained by Paul Kelley, who is perhaps best known for his success with 2016 Dan Patch Award Older Male Trotter of the Year Obrigado (1:50.3; \$1,801,624).

The still-young La Grange looks to be improving since becoming acclimatised to his new home continent. His first American trainer Per Engblom had outlined plans for the Muscle Hill son. "I don't know if he's going to be ready for the early stakes, but by this fall I wouldn't be surprised if he is. He's got a series [the Great Northeast series] at [The Downs at Mohegan Sun] Pocono, then we'll see. We'll see if he develops. He's a big horse, so I think he's going to be better with age. I think he'll be okay."

La Grange has the pedigree for success, being by arguably the top trotting sire in the world, and out of a champion mare La Coocaracha (1:58.5, \$428,911) which won 23 of 36 starts over her career.

La Coocaracha has produced 12 foals, led by 17-time winner Dance Craze (1:55.6,; \$365,10) - a full sister to La Grange.


Now owned by Yabby Dam Farms, La Coocaracha's most recently-registered foal is a 2017 filly by French import Quaker Jet. Maternally, this broodmare descends from the NZ foundation dam Arrogance and downunder mares tracing back to the thoroughbred-sired Treachery.

La Coocaracha's top son has three victories in 13 purse starts this season, even facing the best on this continent on one occasion in the \$250,000 Sprit of Massachusetts Trot at Plainridge Park, which was won by Maple Leaf Trot champion Guardian Angel. La Grange broke and finished seventh. Now in the stable of his third North American trainer, here's hoping La Grange can build upon his racing resume and carry his unique maternal bloodline to greater prominence.

QBRED FOR LIFE

HEAD NORTH FOR A CHANGEOVER

A QUIET ACHIEVER IS ON THE

Queensland stallion roster for the third consecutive season.

New Zealand-bred Changeover is again be based at Burwood Stud.

An out-cross sire, Changeover is by the all-conquering sire of sires, In The Pocket, which is also the sire of champions Christian Cullen and ill-fated Courage Under Fire.

Changeover is owned by Chris Garrard, whose family is a long-time supporter of harness racing in Australia and New Zealand by way of the Garrards Horse and Hound operation.

When you factor in the viability of the QBRED Scheme, a booking to Changeover looks appealing.

A 29-time winner on the track, Queensland harness fans saw Changeover race in the 2009 Inter Dominion in which where he secured a qualifying heat before finishing fourth to Mr Feelgood in the final.

His wins came from two-year-old right through to freefor-all class, including a victory in the Len Smith Mile and famed New Zealand Cup, with a 1.53.4 lifetime mark taken in his Len Smith win over Smoken Up.

Changeover's bloodline is one of the strongest to come out of NZ, being out of Vance Hanover mare Chaangerr, which was out of Nell's Pride (Tuft US-Nell Air NZ).

Chaangerr is a full sister to champion Chokin, a gelding which was the best of his era

At stud, Changeover has already produced six runners inside 1.52, with New Zealand bred Risk having paced a 1.48.4 mile following his export to the US. Run Oneover is another that has taken a lifetime best after arriving in North America, posting a 1.50.8 victory.

In the Southern Hemisphere, his fastest credit sits with Change Of Mind, a son which set a benchmark of 1.51.1 at Menangle. Change Of Mind is from the first crop of Changeover which is now eight years-old.

At the start of this season his Australian-bred numbers have him with 51 winners from just 79 starters in six crops of racing age.

Four of those winners saluted for the Garrards in the closing days of last season.

They celebrated a special moment at Albion Park on August 20 when Changeover three-year-old Goldenblack won debut.

Bred and owned by Chris Garrard, trained by his son Daren and driven by grandson Angus, the gelding rated 1.55.5 for 1660m.

Goldenblack was the ninth live foal of the OK Bye mare Seafield Pearl, ranking himas a half-brother to \$100,000 earners in Miller (Badlands Hanover US) and Well Caught Marsh (Falcon Seelster US), which were also raced by Garrard.



Just one race later the Garrard clan was back in the winners' enclosure, this time with squaregaiter Heart Of Change. A five-year-old mare by Changeover, Heart Of Change is out of the Big Band Sound mare Bravest Of Hearts and it was her first win as a trotter after starting out her career as a multiple race winning pacer. She was converted to squaregaiting early this year - after almost 12 months on the sidelines. In winning, she provided Changeover with his first credit as a sire of a winning trotter.

Two days later another of Changeover's progeny scored at Redcliffe for the Garrards. Four-year-old mare Couldnttellya, out of Live Or Die mare Just Amy, saluted for her breeder, owner and trainer Daren Garrard, and driver by his son Angus, the mare was able to arrive in time to take victory by a neck. It was a bittersweet moment for the Garrards though with Goldenblack having been found dead in his paddock earlier the day.

The week was rounded out on a better note with the Garrard-owned daughter of Changeover, Charlyse saluted at Albion Park. Out of Sokys Atom mare Gliding Atom, this is the same maternal family that has produced the likes of Our Major Mark, Young Modern and the group 2 winner Ima Black Beauty.

A week after the hot streak started, six-year-old gelding Invincible Loxton, a Live Or Die son of Bravest Of Hearts and half-brother to Heart Of Change, scored in a career-best 1.53.1.

The win provided Team Garrard with another threegenerational success, being owned and bred by CJ, trained by Daren and reined by Angus.

His foal numbers reached a new high last season were his highest, with 43 Australian-bred foals hitting the ground - 22 fillies and 21 colts.

His best offspring have been 2016 Inter Dominion finalist Oneover and

The best filly he has produced to date is Victoria Oaks placed Glenferrie Bronte (out of NZ-bred Falcon Seelster mare Equus Franco NZ) who was successful in the Harness Breeders Victoria Argent 3YO Classic.

Changeover's top 10 performers by stakemoney are from eight different broodmare stallions, with Presidential Ball and Falcon Seelster dually represented. Two of his top three performers are mares by Presidential Ball.

FRAWLEY MATTERS

THE NAME FRAWLEY HAS BEEN

synonymous with harness racing for more than 50 years.

Family patriarch, the late Brian Frawley, spent a large part of his life breeding, training and racing horses, as well throwing himself into the administrative side of the sport.

Her served as Ballarat and District Trotting Club president, playing a major role in molding the organization into what it is today.

For the Frawleys, harness racing was a family affair.

Daughter Anne took a front row seat, embarking on a driving career and

becoming best known for her association with Vanderport.

They combined for victory in the 1985 NSW Derby and second in the 1986 Inter Dominion final.

There are several members of the family who have continued the involvement at various levels.

Among these has been one of Brian's sons and VFL/AFL great Danny Frawley, who was appointed to the Harness Racing Victoria board in March, 2016.

Sadly, the former St Kilda champion footballer died in a road crash near Ballarat – not far from where he grew up in potato country at Bungaree – at the age of 56 years.

With his untimely death, it is fitting to reflect on the influence the Frawleys have had on the breeding industry.

There was one maternal line in particular that Brian Frawley developed into a family legacy

And it all began with the 1947 NZ-bred Gold Bar mare Golden Abbess.

It was until midway through her breeding life that Frawley acquired her from the nearby Prendergast family. Frawley bred five foals and it was to be the second Golden Trudy (by Typhoon Ardri US) which was to make the greatest mark.

Golden Abbess also produced Golden Ardri (Ardri), Fashion Gold (Ardri), Quite Daring (Daring Deed) and Future Abbess (Future Monarch).

Golden Ardri was also a good producer – leaving six winners, including Noble Man (Kentucky US) 14 wins, Lahaina (Hilarious Way US) 11 wins; and Noble Gent (Kentucky US) b9 wins.

Golden Trudy left her legacy via handy racemare Trudys Gold (Kentucky US) 10 wins.

She was to produce four winners – Evarestis (Smooth Falcon) 18 wins, \$122,000 and Son of Vanda (Vanderport) 10 wins – and go on to the best the granddam of open class pacer

Grumpy Ole Man (Vanderport) 23 wins, \$213,000.


Foaled in 1992, Grumpy Ole Man was out of Chrismiran (Deep Court), which left four winners, also including Tower of Strength (Tarzan Blue Chip US).

Grumpy Ole Man won a 2000 Inter Dominion heat at Moonee Valley, the 1999 Bohemia Crystal Free-For-All at Harold Park and in the same year the Legends Mile at MV.

What a journey it was for the Frawleys.

NORM MCCLOY ALREADY KNOWS HOW HE

is going to utilise a free service to Ultimate Machete NZ he has won.

He plans to send Art Major mare Whata Avenue to the Alabar-based US-bred stallion.

McCloy from Strathfieldsaye picked up the service as a prize in a Harness Breeders Victoria members' early bird draw.

All HBV members who paid up for 2019-20 by September 1 went into draws for a free service to pacing stallion Ultimate Machete and Niota's trotting stallion Great Success US.

The free service to Great Success went to Bradley O'Keeffe, of Geelong.

McCloy has been involved in harness racing as a breeder and owner for about 40 years and at one stage in the 1990s had interests in about 120 horses – racehorses, mares and stallions.

Truscott Boy (by Keystone Scotch US) was the first pacer he raced, winning 14 races through the 1980s in Victoria and South Australia.

He has had countless winners, but is best known by many as the owner of South Australian-based NZ-bred open class pacer Bonamax – a 1998 son of Whata Baron US and Bonnie Parker NZ – which won 20 races and then at stud went on to leave 152 winners. McCloy stood Whata Baron at stud in SA and over the years has race numerous horses with "Whata" as part of their name.

McCloy has raced horses all around Australia, having had them in the stables of the likes of John McMullen (Queensland), Gary Hill (South Australia), Johnny Tapp

(New South Wales) and John McDermott (Victoria).

With his numbers trimmed back substantially these days, McCloy has a handful with McMullen, McDermott and Matthew Craven.

He also retains a few broodmares and has shares in several stallions, including Art Major, Sportswriter, Rock N Roll Heaven and Roll With Joe.

McCloy said he had been blessed with the success he had had in harness racing and continued to share his interest with his daughters and grandchildren.

Bradley O'Keeffe said the free service to Great Success came at a perfect time.

He said he and his brother Kieran were in the process of turning their focus to the trotting gait.

O'Keeffe, who is a horse breaker and educator, said while he had been around horses many years – his father Laurie is a trainer –he had only had a trainer's licence in his own right about four years.

He said he had had a handful of runners, but it had been sometime since he had had a horse to the races. He race drives though when the opportunity arises.

O'Keeffe said he had never bred more than one or two foals a year.

He said they had moved on their pacing breeding stock and acquired trotting broodmares.

O'Keeffe said he was still deciding which mare to send to Great Success for what would be the first trotter he had bred.

"It's a great opportunity," he said


